

From the *Western Times* 21 Jul 1891:

On Sunday afternoon at St. Andrew's Church, Ashburton, there took place, in conjunction with the Sunday School Festival, the dedication of a new stained glass window placed in the south aisle by the generosity of Mr. W. Michelmores—a native of Ashburton, now living at Plymouth—in memory of his brother, Richard Carlile Michelmores, who died in February last. The window is one of four placed in the aisle by the Michelmores family and like the others is the work of Mr. Fouracre, of Stonehouse. It is a fine four-light window, and each light contains a figure of a Saint, with some incident in the Saint's life depicted. Thus there is St. Paul preaching at Mars-hill; St. John engaged upon the book of the Revelations; St. Peter being commissioned by the Saviour to feed his sheep; and St. James with our Lord at the breaking of bread. Being in strong, rich colours, very harmoniously treated, the window is a rare addition to the decorations of the church.
