I state that Lieut. Muchmore was killed near Westhoek Ridge in a shell hole having a meal on Oct.6th. He was killed instantly and his body carried down to Burcross Road but the party being heavily shelled they had to leave it and when they returned there was no trace of it. He was bearing papers belonging to his batman Gunner Batchelor (wounded) and we found a grave bear Burcross Road with Batchelor's name on. I have arranged to have the body exhumed to Batchelor's name (a big man) or Batchelor (a small one) know of it is Muchmore (a big man) or Batchelor (a small one) Batchelor has not yet been traced. 


