Revoking all other will or wills hear to fore and this to be my last will and Testement *And* first being Penetant and sorey for my sins past homly desiring forgiveness for the same I Give and Commit my Soule to Almighty God my Saver and Redemer in whose and by the Mercys of Jesus Christ I trust and beleve and my Body to be Buried in a desent Maner at the discrition of my Exetors hereafter named.

And now for the Seteling of All my Worly Goods:

Inst I give unto my son John MUCHMORE on Shilling.

Item I give unto my son Henry MUCHMORE on Shilling.

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth KEAST on Shilling.

All the Rest of my Worly Goods I Give and Bequo unto my Dear beloved wife and my son James MUCHMORE and them I make my holl and soll Exetors of this my last Will and Testment in Maner and foram aforesaid.
